Ruggers snatch Coors Cup

On the way to the championship, the Academy defeated Colorado University 16-0, the Denver Highlanders, 8-3 and the Denver Barbarians 21-0.

The B team lost to the Highlanders in the semi-finals 8-3 after defeating Denver University 9-3.

High scorer for the tournament was Tom Grayson with 15 from six conversions and one try, and

Kirt Bentson was close behind with four tries.

Others who put scores on the board were Jack Miller, Carl Stanberry, Gary Tibbetts, Paul Dordal and Bill Gardner.

But as usual all 15 players showed good form, experience, and conditioning. In particular, the coaches singled out Dave MacDougall, Lindsay Fenwick, Bob Rice, Slack Lisenby and Bill Cottingham.

The Rugby Club will now go inactive until the spring when it tackles an ambitious schedule of UCLA, BYU and Cranwell. Practices will begin in February and all are invited to come out (especially third and fourth class).
